Read the meter

The percentage is agreement, not a candidate grade. It is the leading choice's share among sources that explicitly endorsed in that race.
The source count shows the sample behind that percentage.

Read the Times pill

Times agrees same choice
Times differs another choice
Times · not covered no captured pick

Counting and scope

Each organization has equal weight; multi-candidate endorsements split one point. No endorsement and missing coverage stay visible but do not enter the percentage.
LD groups count on broader races they cover, but only their own district's legislative races. Your registration address determines your exact ballot.
